INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with details in respect of (i) the grant of general mandates to Directors to issue and repurchase Shares; (ii) the re-election of retiring Directors; and (iii) to give you notice of the 2016 AGM.

GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND REPURCHASE SHARES

At the 2015 AGM, general mandates were granted to the Directors to (i) allot, issue and deal with additional Shares not exceeding 20% of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company as at that date, and (ii) repurchase the Shares not exceeding 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company as at that date, at

any time until the next annual general meeting or such earlier period as stated in the relevant ordinary resolutions. Such general mandates will be expired after the conclusion of the 2016 AGM and therefore, the ordinary resolutions numbered 8A, 8B and 8C will be proposed at the 2016 AGM to grant new general mandates to the Directors (i) to allot, issue and otherwise deal with additional Shares with an aggregate nominal amount not exceeding 20% of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing the relevant resolution and the extension of the aforesaid mandate by addition thereto the number of Shares repurchased pursuant to the proposed general mandate for repurchase of Shares up to a maximum of 10% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing the relevant resolution as described below, and (ii) to repurchase Shares with total nominal amount not exceeding 10% of the total fully paid-up nominal amount of the share capital of the Company in issue at the date of passing the relevant resolution, at any time during the period ending on the earlier of the date of the next annual general meeting, the date by which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required to be held by law or its Bye-laws or the date upon which such authority is revoked or varied by an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in the general meeting of the Company.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the number of Shares in issue was 13,614,480,666 Shares. On the basis that no further Shares will be issued or repurchased prior to 2016 AGM, (i) the Issue Mandate would enable the Company to allot, issue and deal with a maximum of 2,722,896,133 Shares, and (ii) the Repurchase Mandate would enable the Company to repurchase a maximum of 1,361,448,066 Shares.

The purpose of the grant of the general mandate to the Directors to allot, issue and deal with additional Shares is to enable the Directors to capture right timing of the securities market to widen the capital base of the Company. The Directors believe that the grant of the general mandates is in the interests of the Company and the Shareholders. As at the Latest Practicable Date, the Directors have no present intention to issue or repurchase any Shares under the general mandates to be sought at the 2016 AGM.

An explanatory statement required under Rule 10.06(1)(b) of the Listing Rules containing all the information reasonably necessary to enable the Shareholders to make an informed decision on whether the vote for or against the ordinary resolutions in relation to the Repurchase Mandate is set out in Appendix II to this circular.

RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS

In accordance with the bye-law 86(2) of the Bye-laws, Mr. Chu, Kingston Chun Ho shall retire at the 2016 AGM and, being eligible, will offer himself for re-election at the 2016 AGM.

In accordance with the bye-law 87(1) of the Bye-laws, Mrs. Chu Yuet Wah and Mr. Yu Peter Pak Yan shall retire at the 2016 AGM and, being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election at the 2016 AGM.

Details of the above retiring Directors to be re-elected at the 2016 AGM are set out in Appendix I to this circular in accordance with the relevant requirements of the Listing Rules.

2016 AGM

The notice of the 2016 AGM is set out on pages 14 to 18 of this circular. At the 2016 AGM, ordinary resolutions will be proposed for the Shareholders to consider and, if thought fit, among other things, to approve (i) the grant of general mandates to Directors to issue and repurchase Shares; and (ii) the re-election of the retiring Directors.

A form of proxy for use at the 2016 AGM is sent to the Shareholders together with this circular. Whether or not the Shareholders are able to attend the 2016 AGM, the Shareholders are requested to complete and return the enclosed form of proxy in accordance with the instructions printed thereon as soon as possible and in any event not less than 48 hours before the time for holding of the 2016 AGM or adjournment thereof.

Completion and return of the form of proxy will not preclude the Shareholders from attending and voting at the 2016 AGM should the Shareholders so wish.

All the resolutions proposed to be approved at the 2016 AGM will be taken by poll save that the chairman of the 2016 AGM may in good faith, allow resolutions which relate purely to a procedural or administrative matter to be voted on by a show of hands. An announcement will be made by the Company after the 2016 AGM on the results of the 2016 AGM.

RESPONSIBILITY STATEMENT

This circular, for which the directors of the Company collectively and individually accept full responsibility, includes particulars given in compliance with the Listing Rules for the purpose of giving information with regard to the Company. The Directors, having made all reasonable enquiries, confirm that to the best of their knowledge and belief the information contained in this circular is accurate and complete in all material respects and not misleading or deceptive, and there are no other matters the omission of which would make any statement herein or this circular misleading.

RECOMMENDATION

The Board believes that the grant of general mandates to Directors to issue and repurchase Shares and the re-election of retiring Directors are in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole. Accordingly, the Board recommends the Shareholders to vote in favour of the relevant resolutions to be proposed at the 2016 AGM.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Mrs. Chu Yuet Wah

Mrs. Chu, aged 57, is the Chief Executive Officer and an Executive Director of the Company. She is the co-founder of the Group. She has over 20 years of experience in financial services industry. Mrs. Chu has also been appointed as the Vice Chairman of The Institute of Securities Dealers and Vice Chairman of Hong Kong Securities Professionals Association. Moreover, she is the Member of National Committee of Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference, Permanent Member of the Friends of Hong Kong Association, Founder and Honorary Chairman of The Chamber of Hong Kong Listed Companies, Chairman (2015–16) and Advisory Board Member (2016–17) of Po Leung Kuk, Standing Chairman of Federation of Hong Kong Guangdong Community Organisations, Chairman of the Hong Kong Federation of Dongguan Associations, Chairman of Aplichau Promotion of Tourism Association, Chairman of The Aplichau KaiFong Welfare Association, Honorary President of Hong Kong Army Cades Association, Honorary President of Hong Kong New Arrivals Services Foundation Limited, Honorary Vice President of Hong Kong Girl Guides Association and Director of Sun Yat-Sen University Advisory Board. She received an Honorary Ph. D. degree in Business Management from York University, the United States and holds a Bachelor's degree in Management from Golden Gate University, the United States. Mrs. Chu is currently the chairman and an executive director of Sincere Watch (Hong Kong) Limited which is a company listed on the Main Board of Stock Exchange. Mrs. Chu is the spouse of Mr. Chu, Nicholas Yuk-yui and the mother of Mr. Chu, Kingston Chun Ho. She is also the daughter of Mr. Lee Wai Man, a substantial shareholder of the Company. She joined the Group in April 2005.

Save as disclosed above and also being director of various subsidiaries of the Group, Mrs. Chu does not, and has not had other directorships held in the last three years in public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas, nor any other major appointments and professional qualifications and does not have any relationships with any Directors, senior management or substantial or controlling Shareholder. As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mrs. Chu has the following interests in the securities of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO:

- (1) 8,607,603,895 shares, 1,894,699,896 shares are held by Sure Expert Limited, 15,939,999 shares are held by Kingston Capital Limited and 6,696,964,000 shares are held by Active Dynamic Limited, all of which are controlled by Mrs. Chu Yuet Wah ("Mrs. Chu").
- (2) Mrs. Chu, through Active Dynamic Limited held 3,750,000,000 convertible preference shares conferring rights to subscribe for up to HK\$3,000,000,000 in aggregate in cash for 3,750,000,000 new shares at the conversion price of HK\$0.80 (subject to adjustments) per share.

Saved as disclosed above, Mrs. Chu does not have any interests in the securities of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

Mrs. Chu has entered into a service contract with the Company for an initial term of three years which commenced from 1 April 2014, and will continue thereafter until terminated by either party by giving not less than six months' written notice. She will be subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at the general meeting of the Company in accordance with the By-laws of the Company. Mrs. Chu is entitled to receive a remuneration of approximately HK\$21,450,000 per annum with discretionary bonus, which is determined by the Board with reference to her duties, performance and responsibilities within the Company, the Company's remuneration policy; the prevailing market conditions and with reference to the recommendation of the Remuneration Committee of the Company. Mrs. Chu received a total emoluments of approximately HK\$51,570,000 (including discretionary bonus) for the year ended 31 March 2016.

Save as disclosed above, the Board is not aware of any matter in relation to Mrs. Chu that is required to be disclosed pursuant to paragraphs (h) to (w) of Rule 13.51(2) of the Listing Rules or any other matter that needs to be brought to the attention of the holders of securities of the Company in relation to Mrs. Chu's re-election.

Mr. Chu, Kingston Chun Ho

Mr. Chu, aged 31, is an Executive Director of the Company. Mr. Chu is also a licensed person under Securities and Futures Ordinance for type 1 (dealing in securities) and type 6 (advising on corporate finance) regulated activities for the Company's wholly owned subsidiaries, Kingston Securities Limited and Kingston Corporate Finance Limited respectively. Mr. Chu is a Member of Guangxi Committee of The Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference, Member of General Committee of The Chamber of Hong Kong Listed Companies, Vice President of Hong Kong CPPCC Youth Association, Vice President of Federation of HK Guangxi Community Organisations, Honorary Chairman of Hong Kong Guangxi Youth Organisations, Youth Committee Chairman of Hong Kong Federation of Dongguan Associations and Director of Hong Kong Securities Association. Mr. Chu holds a Bachelor Degree of Business from the University of Southern California in the U.S.A. Mr. Chu is also an executive director of Sincere Watch (Hong Kong) Limited ("Sincere HK"), a company listed on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange, since 29 May 2012, and the vice chairman and managing director of Sincere HK since 13 July 2012. Mr. Chu is a director of Sincere Watch Limited, the immediate holding company of Sincere HK since 21 May 2012. Mr. Chu is the son of Mr. Chu, Nicholas Yuk-yui and Mrs. Chu Yuet Wah. Mr. Chu is also the grandson of Mr. Lee Wai Man, a substantial shareholder of the Company. Mr. Chu joined the Group in July 2010 and was appointed as Executive Director on 21 August 2015.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. Chu does not, and has not had other directorships held in the last three years in public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas, nor any other major appointments and professional qualifications; Mr. Chu does not hold other positions in the Company or other members of the Group and does not have any relationship with any other Directors, senior management, substantial or controlling Shareholders.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Chu does not have any interest in the shares of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

There is no service contract between Mr. Chu and the Company. Mr. Chu will be subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at annual general meeting of the Company in accordance with the Bye-laws. Mr. Chu is entitled to a monthly remuneration of HK\$180,000 for his directorship with effect from 21 August 2015. He is also entitled to receive discretionary bonus having regard to the performance of Mr. Chu and the Company. The emoluments are determined by reference to his duties and responsibilities, the Company's remuneration policy, the prevailing market conditions, and with reference to the recommendation of the Remuneration Committee of the Company. Mr. Chu received a total emoluments of approximately HK\$2,467,000 (including discretionary bonus) for the year ended 31 March 2016. The amount included remuneration of approximately HK\$533,000 received before the date of appointment as Executive Director.

Save as disclosed above, there is no other information which is required to be disclosed pursuant to Rule 13.51(2)(h) to (v) of the Listing Rules, and there is no other matter that needs to be brought to the attention of the shareholders of the Company in relation to Mr. Chu's re-election.

INDEPENDENT NON-EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR**Mr. Yu Peter Pak Yan**

Mr. Yu Peter Pak Yan, aged 65, is an Independent Non-executive Director of the Company. He has extensive experience in real estate and financial services industries. Mr. Yu has a Bachelor Degree in Management from Youngstown State University in Ohio, USA and a Master of Science Degree in Financial Services from American College in Pennsylvania, USA. Mr. Yu is a member of the Certified Commercial Investment Member Institute and was the first Chinese-American elected to the board of the San Francisco Association of Realtors. Mr. Yu worked in Pacific Union Real Estate Company in the United States from 1980–1995 and held senior positions in MetLife and New York Life Insurance Company in managing Asian customers in North America. Mr. Yu is an executive director of Far East Holdings International Limited, and an independent non-executive director of Noble Century Investment Holdings Limited (formerly known as Sam Woo Holdings Limited) and China Sandi Holdings Limited, which are companies listed on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange. He was an executive director and Chairman of Kong Sun Holdings Limited from August 2008 to August 2014. He was an independent non-executive director of Get Holdings Limited (formerly known as M Dream Inworld Limited) for the period from July 2010 to January 2014, which is a company listed on the GEM of the Stock Exchange. He joined the Group in September 2008.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. Yu does not, and has not had other directorships held in the last three years in public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas, nor any other major appointments and professional qualifications. Mr. Yu does not have any relationships with any Directors, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholder of the Company. Mr. Yu does not hold other positions with the Company or other members of the Group.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Yu does not have any interest in the securities of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

Mr. Yu has executed a letter of appointment with the Company for a term of one year which commenced on 1 April 2016, and subject to compliance with relevant requirements of the Listing Rules, and will continue thereafter until terminated by either party by giving not less than three months' written notice. He will be subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at annual general meeting of the Company in accordance with the bye-laws of the Company. Mr. Yu received a total emoluments of approximately HK\$240,000 for the year ended 31 March 2016. His emoluments after the re-election will be determined by the Remuneration Committee of the Company with reference to his duties and responsibilities, the Company's remuneration policy, the prevailing market conditions, and with reference to the recommendation of the Remuneration Committee of the Company.

Save as disclosed above, the Board is not aware of any matter in relation to Mr. Yu that is required to be disclosed pursuant to Rule 13.51(2) of the Listing Rules or any other matter that need to be brought to the attention of the holders of securities of the Company in relation to Mr. Yu's re-election.

REPURCHASE MANDATE

The following is the explanatory statement required to be sent to the Shareholders under the Listing Rules relating to an ordinary resolution to be proposed at the 2016 AGM to be held on 19 August 2016, to approve a general and unconditional mandate to be given to the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to repurchase, at any time until the next annual general meeting of the Company or such earlier period as stated in the ordinary resolution, Shares of HK\$0.02 each in the capital of the Company, up to a maximum of 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing the resolution.

The Directors believe the Repurchase Mandate is in the interests of the Company and the Shareholders, and accordingly recommend the Shareholders to vote in favour of the relevant resolution to be proposed at the 2016 AGM.

SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the number of Shares in issue was 13,614,480,666 Shares. On the basis that no further Shares will be issued or repurchased prior to the 2016 AGM, the exercise of the Repurchase Mandate in full would enable the Company to repurchase a maximum of 1,361,448,066 Shares.

REASONS FOR REPURCHASE

Repurchase of Shares will only be made if the Directors believe that such repurchase will be in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders. Such repurchase may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangement at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value of the Company and/or earnings per share.

FUNDING OF REPURCHASE

In repurchasing Shares, the Company may only apply funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with the Company's constitutive documents and the laws of Bermuda in which the Company was incorporated.

There might be a material adverse impact on the working capital and/or gearing position of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in the audited financial statements contained in the annual report of the Company for the year ended 31 March 2016, being the date to which the latest published audited financial statements of the Company have been made up) in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is exercised in full. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances,

have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company and/or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

UNDERTAKING

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange to exercise the powers of the Company to make repurchase pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules, the applicable laws of Bermuda and the Bye-laws.

None of the Directors, or to the best of their knowledge having made all reasonable enquiries, any of their associates have any present intention to sell to the Company or its subsidiaries any of the Shares in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is granted.

No connected person (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company has notified the Company that he has a present intention to sell to the Company or its subsidiaries any of his Shares, or has undertaken not to do so, in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is exercised.

TAKEOVERS CODE AND SHARE REPURCHASES

In the event that the exercise of the power to repurchase Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code. As a result, a Shareholder or group of Shareholders acting in concert could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory general offer in accordance with Rules 26 and 32 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mrs. Chu Yuet Wah and parties acting in concert with her are interested or deemed to be interested in an aggregate of 10,157,205,895 Shares, representing approximately 74.61% of the existing issued share capital of the Company.

In the event that the Directors exercise in full their power to repurchase Shares in accordance with the terms of the Repurchase Mandate, the interest of Mrs. Chu Yuet Wah and parties acting in concert with her will be increased to approximately 82.9% of the issued share capital of the Company. Such increase would not give rise to an obligation to make a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code. The Directors are not aware of any consequence which may arise under the Takeovers Code as a result of any repurchases to be made under the Repurchase Mandate.

Assuming there is no further issue of Shares between the Latest Practicable Date and the date of repurchase, the exercise of the Repurchase Mandate whether in whole or in substantial part will result in less than 25% of the issued share capital of the Company being held by the public as required by Rule 8.08 of the Listing Rules. The Directors, however, have no present intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to an extent as may result in a public shareholding of less than such prescribed percentage.
